## Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Visitors.

The Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our lives, as St. John Paul II often reminded the world. In these three years of Eucharistic Revival, it would be good to look to the example of the Saints to learn about their devotion to Christ in the Eucharist, and how we can best emulate their devotion.

#### (Part 1) St Thomas Aquinas (1224-1274).

During his second tenure as professor in Paris. St. Thomas found himself in the middle of a dispute taking place among the professors at the Sorbonne University in regard to the Eucharistic sacrament. The dispute was about two points: a) if the senses perceive the presence of the socalled "accident", such as color, taste, durability and quantity, it would be the concrete extension of the true and real Eucharistic Bread and Wine: b) faith confirms that in the sacrament exists the Body and Blood of Christ, which is an apparent contrast with the former theory. Parisian theologians were clearly divided between the objective theory and the value of faith. They decided to ask St. Thomas because they already had opportunity of experiencing his philosophical intelligence and his theological sanctity. They asked him to offer and communicate his opinion, in that his theological wisdom would become the rule to follow.

Thomas then, as he usually did, retreated himself to prayer and contemplation and started to pray with great fervor and devotion. Soon after, he quickly jotted down in writing the least amount of words with the most precise clarity possible, what his mind was able to understand and what The Lord inspired him to write.
