Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,
The Eucharist is the “*source and summit*” of our lives, as St. John Paul II often reminded the world. In these three years of Eucharistic Revival, it would be good to look to the example of the Saints to learn about their devotion to Christ in the Eucharist, and how we can best emulate their devotion.

(Part 1) **Saint Imelda Lambertini** ((1322-1333) is one of the youngest saints of the Church, joining her Maker in Heaven at age eleven. Her yearning for the Holy Eucharist, and simple faith in the Lord remind us of the words of Jesus: "Truly I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it at all" (Mark 10:15). Imelda was born into one of the oldest and wealthiest families of Bologna, Italy. Her parents were both devout Catholics, and Imelda was taken to Mass on a daily basis. From her mother, she learned to give her life in service to others, taking care of the poor of her town. Her mother also instructed her in the history and concept of the Holy Eucharist, which lit a fire in Imelda's heart for a closer relationship with the Lord. Even at the young age of five, she would spend the majority of her time alone in prayer, arranging a sacred space in the corner of her room, adorned with flowers and pictures. It was on the occasion of her fifth birthday that Imelda asked her pious parents if she also could receive First Communion. She already possessed a love of Christ, but she was far too young. With an understanding of what communion really means, she wondered aloud:

“Tell me, can anyone receive Jesus into his heart and not die?”

Viva Cristo Rey!
