

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,
Today in our Parish we celebrate Stewardship Sunday.

Stewardship is based on the spiritual principles of the Old Testament and the teachings of Christ. Stewardship is a way of life. It is a way of thanking God for all His blessings by returning a portion of the Time, Talent and Treasure given to us.
