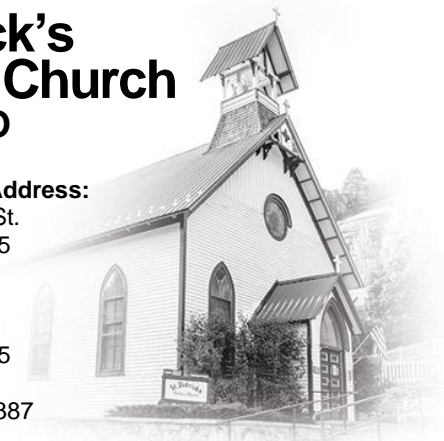

Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Believing that the Eucharist is truly the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ, can be difficult, even for some Catholics. In order to strengthen our faith in the Real Presence God has blessed us with many Eucharistic Miracles throughout the history of the Church. Let's learn about some of them as we celebrate Eucharistic Revival in our Church in America.

Tixtla, Mexico. In October 2006, a parish in the Chilpancingo-Chilapa Diocese of Mexico held a retreat. During Holy Mass, two priests and a religious sister were distributing Holy Communion when the religious sister looked at the celebrant with tears in her eyes. The Host that she held had begun to effuse a reddish substance.

To determine the validity of the event, Bishop Alejo Zavala Castro asked Dr. Ricardo Castañón Gómez (who researched the Eucharistic miracle in Buenos Aires) and his team to conduct scientific research.

In 2013, the research concluded that: “The reddish substance analyzed corresponds to blood in which there are hemoglobin and DNA of human origin. . . The blood type is AB, similar to the one found in the Host of Lanciano and in the Holy Shroud of Turin.” Two studies conducted by eminent forensic experts with different methodologies have shown that the substance originates from the interior, excluding the hypothesis that someone could have placed it from the exterior. A microscopic analysis of magnification and penetration reveals that the superior part of the blood has been coagulated since October 2006. Moreover, the underlying internal layers reveal, in February 2010, the presence of fresh blood. On account of the scientific results and the conclusions reached by the theological committee, on October 12 the Bishop of Chilpancingo, his Eminence Alejo Zavala Castro, announced the following: - *The event does not have a natural explanation.* - *It does not have paranormal origin.* - *It is not traceable to manipulation of the enemy.*” Viva Cristo Rey!
